Wayne Harper Honored with 2024 Archie League Medal of Safety Award for the Alaskan Region

On February 1, 2024, Wayne Harper, an air traffic controller at Anchorage ATCT (ANC), showcased exceptional composure and quick decision-making during a critical situation at Anchorage International Airport. Amid recordbreaking snow accumulation and challenging visibility, Harper swiftly issued a go-around command to an incoming aircraft after noticing a disoriented plane on the runway. His decisive actions prevented a potentially catastrophic runway incursion.

Alaskan Regional Vice President Clint Lancaster presented Harper with the 2024 Archie League Medal of Safety Award for the Alaskan Region.

On January 23, 2024, a team of air traffic controllers at Wichita ATCT (ICT) faced a critical situation when a military aircraft struggled with poor weather conditions and low fuel while attempting to land. Tyler Spencer, Cody Wilkerson, William Wyatt, Anthony DeHaven, Cameron Haynes, and Allison Healey demonstrated exceptional teamwork and quick thinking, guiding the aircraft through multiple failed landing attempts to a successful and safe landing at Wichita Airport.

Central Regional Vice President Aaron Merrick presented Spencer, Wyatt, DeHaven, and Haynes with the 2024 Archie League Medal of Safety Award for the Central Region. *Wilkerson and Healey were not present to accept their awards in person.*

Bernhardt provided radar vectors, while Wilson coached the pilot during the critical final approach, ensuring a successful outcome.
