

NATCA Photography Parental Consent Authorization

NATCA does not publicly post photos of children without a written record of parental/guardian consent. If taking photos at a member or outreach event, signed photo releases from parents of children should be collected. Standard verbiage of these releases is found below. This consent can be as informal as a text or email, but must be in writing.

If taking photos of minor children, IF THE FACE OF THE MINOR CHILD IS VISIBLE, the parent/guardian must submit written consent to the photographer or NATCA member taking photos. This record of consent should be forwarded to NATCA Public Affairs.
